A New Face for Kirkby

September 2017

Recently opened, in a prime site in the middle of town, a new, expanded visitor information and gift shop - and it's already proving popular with the local community as well as those who visit.

The Kirkby Lonsdale & Lune Valley Community Interest Company opened the new facility, in the former HSBC bank building, in June after protracted negotiations to acquire the lease.

'Moving from 24 Main Street to 29 Main Street sounds a relatively easy exercise,' said Tourism and Town Manager Sarah Ross. 'But it took our small team some considerable time and effort to make it happen. But it's been worth it because we have seen more people coming in to buy or to find out about our town, and coach parties are now making us their first port of call.'

The new shop offers an expanded variety of gifts and souvenirs, including a range of Tulchan clothing which spotlights the architecture of the town. Help is offered to those seeking accommodation for a long or short stay, tickets can be booked for local attractions, and a series of guided town walks has proved particularly popular.

Volunteers give up just a few hours a week to keep the premises open seven days a week.

From the Team Ministry

Who would have thought it?

Who would have thought that spending 5 days in Westmorland General Hospital would be such a positive experience and an illustration in Christian living? Well, these were not my first thoughts. Yes, I had expected to come out with a new hip, the old one had become a bit painful to live with, but I did not quite expect to witness a society which had my and all other patients' well-being and comfort as the priority.

In the bible, in Romans chapter 12, St Paul urges the Roman Christians to be living sacrifices. 'For by the grace given me I say to every one of you 'Do not think of yourself more highly than you ought, but rather think of yourself with sober judgement, in accordance with the measure of faith God has given you. Just as each of us has one body with many members (parts) and these members do not all have the same function, so in Christ we who are many, form one body, and each member belongs to all the others. We have different gifts according to grace given to us.'

And so it is with the finely tuned team of professionals whom I met in hospital. There was the Ward Clerk, Nurse and Doctor who welcomed us, took a medical history and some blood. The anaesthetist and surgeon visited us on the ward, to discuss the operation, making sure we had no questions or particular concerns. The Nurse and Porter who took us to the Operating Theatre, and the Theatre technician who was waiting patiently for us to wake up after the operation, to make sure that we were comfortable.

Then back on the Ward, we were looked after by so many different Nurses and Practitioners, providing regular blood pressure and temperature checks right through the night, saline drips, bedpans, meals, help with trips to toilet, and to the shower. I must not forget the Physiotherapists who taught us to walk again, (how could we forget in such a short time?) and the cleaners who kept the wards supplied with gowns and dressings etc, and hygienic, by frequently sweeping and mopping. All these professionals seemed to have just one goal in life, to make their patients healthy and comfortable. This is why we should really value our local hospital and why we should NEVER let the bureaucrats close it down. But more than that, we should take note of the lesson that WGH society teaches us.

These staff are using their God given gifts in the service of others.

So I ask you and myself, what are we good at? No matter how young or old we may be, could we use our God given gifts to help others? Could we help in our churches, or locally for example, in work with children or the elderly? As St Paul says, in society, each member belongs to all the others. Let's be like the staff of WGH: let's get involved with our local community, and if we choose wisely, we will enjoy it as much as those we are helping.

Do you have access to a car, and would you be willing to provide transport to local people who do not have their own transport?

Volunteer Drivers is looking for additional volunteers who would be willing to give a little of their time to help those who do not have their own transport. Journeys are mostly on a one-off basis, and typically to a local hospital for outpatient appointments or to the local surgery or similar. Occasionally longer journeys are requested.

Most clients are of retired age but able bodied. Volunteers give their time free of charge, but the client contributes to car running costs at the rate of 45p per mile.

I act as "match maker" between clients and volunteers, and I never pressure volunteers to take on a journey when it is not convenient. I can work with volunteers

who may be available only part time, such as mornings only, as well as those who are regularly available, and I try to spread the load as evenly as I can across the pool of volunteers.

Have you had problems with online parcel delivery?

Citizens Advice research has found that two in three online shoppers have had parcels delivered late, damaged, left in non-secure places like rubbish bins, or 'failed' - where they wait in, only to receive a note saying they were out.

The retailer is responsible for getting orders delivered to you, not the parcel company. Contact the sender if an item hasn't arrived by the date agreed or within 30 days. You can cancel the order and get a refund for the goods and basic (not premium) delivery costs.

If a parcel is damaged, contact the retailer and they should either offer to send you a new item or refund you. If someone was waiting at home for the parcel, but a note said it couldn't be delivered, you can cancel the order and get a refund if it's been less than 14 days since you bought it – or just arrange another delivery time. Although legally you're not entitled to compensation, it's worth complaining to the delivery firm and retailer.

If you get a note saying your parcel has been left in a certain location but it isn't there, the retailer should replace it or give you your money back. If you receive the item but aren't happy with where it was left, complain to both the retailer and delivery firm, though there is no legal right to compensation.

I'm planning a long holiday and have been struggling to find travel insurance for a reasonable price. I've found a good deal from a Facebook advert but my friend thinks it might be a scam. How can I be sure if it's legitimate?

Your friend is right - you should do some research on the company first.

Insurance sellers must be registered with the Financial Conduct Authority (FCA) - check on the FCA website. If they aren't listed, don't use them. If they are, it's still worth doing further checks.

Compare the price to similar offers from competitors. Big discounts are often a telltale sign of a scam, but the policy could be cheap because it doesn't provide adequate cover. Ask for a copy of the full policy so you can check what you will get. If the seller won't provide one upfront, don't use them.

Once you know the seller is legitimate use a secure payment method, not a bank transfer.



View from the Bridge



I was elected as Chairman of the Kirkby Lonsdale Town Council in July and look forward to the challenges ahead - both imminent and longer-term - to secure the well-being of our Town for this and future generations.

The Council is now back to full strength with the recent appointment of two new members, Mrs Marie Batty and Mr Mike Burchnall, both of whom we believe have much to contribute to the diversity of the group.

Around the Town we have made good headway towards redressing the earlier hiccups over the maintenance of our green spaces. We are confident that our newly-appointed Town Maintenance Contractor will have us looking smart and tidy again from the outset in 2018. That said, of current visual concern is the proliferation of weeds. Some areas are not the responsibility of your Town Council, but since CCC recently took over the weed control of those areas it is now evident, both in and around the Town, that the County Council has failed dismally. We are not alone - many towns are reporting the same problems. We have instructed our Maintenance Contractor to deal with them in the meantime, but the end of the 'growing season' is imminent and the benefits will not be immediately obvious. Please be patient.

The concerns of a number of families whose children use the (Tram Lane) Play Park have been brought to the Council's attention regarding some dog owners who frequently walk or exercise their animals in that field. Whilst we advertise our Town as 'dog friendly', the selfish few who steadfastly refuse to 'clean up' after their pets are putting the health and welfare of our young people in jeopardy. From now on dogs will not be allowed in the Play Park and new signs to this effect will be placed at each of the two main gates.

The Town Council will also be reviewing the 'Town Plan', which will include recommendations arising from the Parking Group Review. I will do my best to keep you informed as the various stages of the Plan take shape.

Finally, although I have been elevated to the 'top' chair, I remain very much part of 'the team' and more than happy to be a 'hands-on' Chairman. Equally, if you would like to chat either formally or informally, I hope you will not hesitate to be in touch and I will do whatever I can to help or advise. On the evening of Wednesday 19th July Kirkby Lonsdale experienced a sudden flash flood unlike anything people had seen before. Roads turned to rivers, properties flooded and then just as soon as it had arrived it went again - within a few hours most places were dry again.

Clearly flooding is a serious issue and more Kirkby Lonsdale properties (particularly commercial properties in Market Street and Main Street) were flooded on 19th July than during Storm Desmond. I am doing my best to find out if there are any genuine problems with the drainage network or if we need to accept that every now and then an extreme event will occur that is beyond the capacity of even the best-maintained network.

It is easy to think of Queens Square, Market Street, Main Street and Market Square as a flat plateau set on land which is generally sloping down from High Biggins, the A65 at Tearnside and Kearnstwick towards the River Lune. Water pouring down Kendal Road, New Road, Mitchelgate and Fairbank all heads towards the flat commercial area of town and gathers there before being carried down to the river.

If you look around the centre of town there are plenty of gullies on the streets ie the heavy cast iron gratings that lie above the drain network (most people just call them 'drains' although technically drains are the underground pipes). The gullies were inspected shortly after the flash flood and they are not blocked.

I have asked CCC to check the capacity of the main carrier drains – all the gullies feed into these in a herringbone pattern. If the carrier drains are partially filled with silt they will cope with normal rainfall but struggle with heavy rainfall events. Then there are the hidden culverts: one that runs from Fairgarth Drive to Mill Brow and down to the river; another that runs from QES Sports Hall under Booths to emerge on Back Lane near the cricket pitch. Again, if these are not working efficiently they will put extra pressure on the Highways drainage network. I have asked for cameras to examine the state of these culverts.

In the short term it is certainly worth knowing where your nearest gully / drain is located and keeping an eye on it. In extreme events like the flash flood it is sometimes possible to resolve the problem by scraping away debris which quickly accumulates and blocks the top of the gully.

And although it is the last thing on your mind, any photos you can take will be really useful to plan for the future.

From time to time we hear of, or read about, incidents where people have their lives changed by a totally unexpected event – such as a road accident. Those who have experienced this, or their closest relations, say that one element of support that could have helped is towards unexpected costs, such as travel, accommodation etc. Some may even suffer from loss of income or loss of wages whilst caring for their loved one in hospital. With this in mind local residents of Kirkby Lonsdale formed the Kirkby Lonsdale Community Trauma Relief Fund.

The aim of the charity is to provide a one off payment to an individual who either lives in Kirkby Lonsdale or can demonstrate a close current relationship with the town or its immediate area, or to their immediate family or partner following a sudden, unexpected life changing incident, as a gesture of goodwill and to alleviate immediate financial pressure. The incident would normally result in a period in critical care in excess of 24 hours, or death:- the charity is aimed at those who suffer from a devastating unexpected incident, although an award would not normally be made for medical conditions.

Do support this charity if you can – you never know when you might need us.


